#### LEARNING STRATEGIES

#### Supporting learning

- Bring literacy to where people are
- Meet immediate needs
- Flexible/Adaptable/ Informal
- Mutual respect/Building trust/Offering consistency

#### Literacy moments

- "Captures the pace and spontaneity of doing literacy work in a drop-in or shelter"
- Quick and specific
- Normalizing learning : destigmatize literacy and literacy issues

#### KEY POINTS FOR PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

#### Staff and Volunteers

- Trained & supported
- Creating anti-discrimination policies in Clear language and design so that the space is safe

- Program is flexible and informal
- Variety of approaches used, including small group and one to one tutoring
- Drop in format




