Message from the Board Chair and the Executive Director

In a year like no other, we are pleased with what we accomplished. In November 2019, we brought together over 250 participants for two days of inspired learning and shared best practices at the Decoda Literacy Conference. Community groups, libraries and schools across the province celebrated Family Literacy Week in January with the theme "Let's Read Together!"

When the COVID-19 pandemic hit, we responded to support literacy programs overwhelmed by the need in their communities. We partnered with Literacy Outreach Coordinators on a matching gift campaign: Literacy matters more than ever! During Literacy Month in September, we held our first ever virtual team trivia fundraising event and welcomed teams from across BC. Thanks to our generous individual and corporate supporters, we raised over \$40,000 in emergency funds.

We are inspired by the work of literacy practitioners across BC, who rose to the challenges posed by the pandemic with resilience and creativity.

As always, we are grateful to our government partners: BC Ministry of Education; BC Ministry of Advanced Education and Skills Training, Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) and Employment and Social Development Canada. Our Work

Literacy Outreach Coordination: We support a network of 100 Literacy Outreach Coordinators who work in over 400 BC communities. The numbers below show the activity throughout the network in the 2019-2020 program year:

- 2,223 community members worked on community literacy action plans
- 12,758 adults engaged in improving their reading, writing, technology and financial skills
- 21,110 adults engaged in their children's learning
- 32,370 children engaged in early literacy learning
- 30,270 school-aged children and youth engaged in improving their reading, writing and financial skills
- 5,638 seniors engaged in improving their reading, writing, technology and financial skills
- 51,329 people participated in literacy related workshops, seminars and events



Literacy Matters more than ever

Support for literacy practitioners:

Decoda has done an exceptional job of weathering the COVID-19 pandemic and finding creative ways to continue to support its provincial team. Regular opportunities to check-in and facilitate dialogue between LOCs have been a welcome way to hear about how literacy has been impacted over the last several months and what colleagues are doing to address it.

Programs and Services

Decoda provides valuable services to the literacy network and the community at large.

- The Decoda Literacy Library provides over 5000 resources free to borrow anywhere in BC. It houses resources on adult literacy, youth literacy, family literacy, early learning, non-profit management, and financial literacy.
- Fostering Literacy works with children (in particular, those in foster care) who struggle with reading. In 2019-20, trained volunteers and high school students provided one-to-one tutoring to over 340 children in 16 communities.
- Immigrant Parents as Literacy Supporters (IPALS) welcomed 800 immigrant and refugee family members in 19 sites in BC in 2019-20, providing a play-based, bilingual family literacy program that helps prepare children for school in Canada.
- The Westcoast Reader is a valuable print and online resource for learners of all ages, with a print distribution of 17,000 copies per month in addition to digital access for subscribers.
- Displaced Workers is a three-year project with Essential Skills Development Canada designed to identify supports for workers who have been displaced to improve their employability.
- Decoda provides BC's 94 Community Adult Literacy Programs (CALP) with training, resources and support.




