## **Play Party Games**

#### **Build a story**

This game is a creative and interactive activity where each person contributes a part of the story, building on what the previous person said. It helps with listening skills, vocabulary development, teamwork, etc.

#### What you need:

- two or more participants
- optional: pencil and paper

#### What you do:

- **1.** Gather players into a circle on the floor or around a table.
- **2.** Choose one person to start off the story by saying a sentence, for example, "Once upon a time, there was a curious cat."
- **3.** The next person continues the story by adding their sentence. Each person should try to build on what the previous person said, creating an imaginative story.
- **4.** The game can continue until everyone has had multiple turns (between 2-5 turns each), or you can decide on a specific number of rounds to play.
- **5.** When the story is coming to an end, the last player adds a closing sentence that wraps up the tale.

#### Variations:

- You can make the game more challenging by introducing special words that players must use in their sentences, such as adding certain numbers, or mentioning some animals.
- Pass the story: You can use a ball that is soft and safe for indoor use to pass around. The person with the ball will be the person to add a sentence. Once the starting sentence is spoken, hand the ball to anyone in the circle for them to add to the story.

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
